Information regarding Regulation of Persistent, Bioaccumulative, and Toxic Chemicals Under TSCA Section 6(h)

RealSense is committed to protecting the environment and complying with all hazardous substance regulations. To that end, Intel tracks the material content of our products and makes that information available to our business partners. This letter provides important information about compliance with the regulation of five Persistent, Bioaccumulative, and Toxic (PBT) substances under US Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) Section 6(h).

The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued final rules on five PBT substances under TSCA Section 6(h). These five substances are [Decabromodiphenyl ether \(DecaBDE\)](#), [Phenol, isopropylated phosphate \(3:1\) \(PIP \(3:1\)\)](#), [2,4,6-Tris\(tert-butyl\)phenol \(2,4,6-TTBP\)](#), [Hexachlorobutadiene \(HCBd\)](#) and [Pentachlorothiophenol \(PCTP\)](#). EPA restricts the manufacture (including import), processing, and distribution of these five PBT substances and products containing them starting from Mar. 8, 2021 (varied by substances). However, in response to concerns from the industry, the EPA agreed to re-examine the rules for these five substances. On March 8, the EPA issued a [180-day No-Action Assurance](#), essentially suspending the rule for 6 months (until September 4, 2021), and opened a 60-day public comment period for the public to provide new input on the final rule.

To the best of our knowledge, none of these five PBT substances are used in RealSense products placed on the US market after August 2021. RealSense aligns its [RealSense® Regulatory Information](#) with [IEC 62474 standard](#). The IEC has included the substances that may be used in electrotechnical products (i.e. DecaBDE and PIP (3:1)) in the [IEC 62474 Declarable Substance List \(DSL\)](#).

All information RealSense provides on the material content of our products is true and accurate to the best of our knowledge. We will continue to monitor the substance regulatory requirements as part of our on-going compliance activities.
